- The Defendant is the Arizona Corporation Commission ("Commission"), an agency of the State of Arizona that is established by Article 15 of the Arizona Constitution.
- On September 3, 2015, SunZia Transmission, LLC ("SunZia") filed an application for a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility ("CEC") under ACC Docket No. L-00000YY-15-0318-00171.
- On October 6, 2015, Plaintiff filed a Notice of Intent to Intervene regarding SunZia's application for a CEC.
- 6. On October 19, 2015, the Arizona Power Plant and Transmission Line Siting Committee ("Committee") approved a motion to allow Plaintiff to intervene in SunZia's application for a CEC.
- 7. On November 19, 2015, following 13 days of hearings, the Committee voted 8 to 0 in favor of granting SunZia a CEC for construction of their project.
  - 8. On November 24, 2015, the Chairman of the Committee issued this CEC.
- 9. On December 8, 2015, Plaintiff filed a Request for Review by the Commission, on the grounds set forth therein.
- 10. On February 3, 2016, following two days of review, the Commission voted 3 to 2 to approve the CEC prepared by the Committee, reflected in Commission Decision No. 75464 and Dissenting Opinion issued on February 22, 2016.
- On March 11, 2016, Plaintiff filed an Application for Rehearing of Decision No.75464 with the Commission on the grounds set forth therein.
- 12. Pursuant to A.R.S. § 40-253, the Plaintiff's Application for Rehearing was denied by operation of law on March 31, 2016.
- 13. Pursuant to A.R.S. § 40-254, any party in interest being dissatisfied with an order or decision of the Commission may within thirty days after a rehearing is denied commence an

1	action in Superior Court against the Commission as defendant to vacate, set aside, affirm in part,		
2	reverse in part, or remand with instructions to the Commission such order or decision on the		
3	ground that the order or decision is unlawful or unreasonable.		
4	14. Commission Decision No. 75464 is unlawful or unreasonable for the reasons set		
5	forth in the Plaintiff's Application for Rehearing, which are incorporated by this reference as if		
6	fully set forth herein.
